Enid Lake

LOCATION: Enid Lake is located approximately 12 miles south of Batesville, near Interstate 55.

SIZE: The permanent pool is approximately 6,100 acres and flood control pool is approximately 28,000 acres.

DEPTH: Depth varies with reservoir stage.

AOUATIC VEGETATION: None.

MAJOR SPORTFISH: Crappie, catfish, bream, white bass, striped bass, and largemouth bass.

OTHER FISH: Bowfin, buffalo, common carp, drum, flathead catfish, green sunfish, gar

FISH FORAGE: Shad, minnows, sunfish.

VISIBLE COVER: Willow flats, buttonbush, cypress trees, rip-rap.

BOTTOM FEATURES: Dropoffs, man-made fish structures, sandbars, creek channels.
